The Canadian Labour International Film Festival (CLiFF) is the Workers' Film Festival that **brings the films to you**. Our Festival-in-a-Box packages are designed to help you host a film screening in your workplace, union hall, city, town or village – you choose the venue!

2020 will be our 12th film festival. We have shown over 185 films about work and workers in over 190 locations across Canada!



WHAT DOES CLIFF DO?

Each year we accept short film submissions from all over the world. Our volunteer Board selects the films that will be viewed as part of the festival and creates packages, usually of 1 and 2 hour lengths. Anyone can sign up to host a film screening in their area and will be sent the films free of charge.

With the help of our ever growing network of Festival Coordinators, we give filmmakers exposure across Canada and bring community attention to labour films that may otherwise not have the reach. We also pay artists fees to the film maker's when their film is shown in our festival.

We do a significant amount of fundraising work and are financially supported by many labour unions, district labour councils, as well as pro-labour and social justice organizations.

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE?

November is Labour Film Month, and we try to coordinate the film screening events to take place that month.
